HISTORIAN REPORT 2024-2025

When I first tell people I belong to the Salisbury Garden Club, I mention our Educational Speakers, Workshops on Flower Design, Gardening Tips and Field Trips and then I tell them what makes me the most proud. It's how we reach out to our community and strive to improve and make our neighborhoods a better place. Every third Wednesday from September through May, our Club meets at the Manakin Episcopal Church. The morning begins at 9:30 with coffee and refreshments provided by our members. The Meeting commences at 10:00 with our Gardener's Creed followed by interesting and informative programs.

Our 2024-2025 Officers have worked diligently to make a difference in our community and in our everyday lives.

Our President, Becky Sido - She has chosen the theme "Caring for our World". One of her prime objectives is to



introduce children on how to protect our environment and use resources wisely. One of our ongoing projects this year was recycling plastic. Last year we were able to collect enough plastic to secure our first Trex bench for

the Wishing Well Park. This year with the help of our members and the Manakin Episcopal Church members, we were able to collect over 1,000 pounds of plastic which enabled us to get a Trex bench for the Church. This project will be continued for the upcoming year.

Our First Vice Presidents, Lynn Neviaser and Fran Stanwix - This year they have provided us with programs ranging from Nature on the James River, Bug Farming, Working with Clay, Floral Photography, Orchids of the First Ladies, Black Bears in Virginia, Invasive Plants, Design Demonstrations and Ikebana. We were also fortunate to be able to tour the Chadwick & Son Orchid Greenhouse, a Photography tour at Lewis Ginter and a visit to the VMFA Fine Arts & Flowers.

Our Second Vice President, Peggy Young - She has helped in guiding new and prospective members, introducing them to the Club and presenting them with our yearbook and essential items for displaying horticultural. She also presides over the New Member Brunch which this year was held at the home of Katie Conschafter. We were happy to welcome our newest members Jo-De Davis, Cheryl Reynolds, Anne Margaret White and Liz Trolan. **Recording Secretary, Katie Conschafter** - She keeps detailed notes of our Board and General Meetings, which is essential in helping us remember what was discussed at the Meetings.

Corresponding Secretary, Delora Stites - She reaches out to the membership with cards and good wishes. She coordinates and sends our Club's publicity to the nearby community organizations for inclusion in their publications.

Treasurer, Claudia Cosby - She keeps the Club's financial records which helps us to maintain the balance between incoming and outgoing funds. She also tabulates the sign-up sheets keeping everyone aware of who signs up for our projects. She is instrumental in collecting spare change each month for the "Plant a Tree" Organization. A donation of \$225 was made this year.

Our 2024-2025 Board Members have maintained the high standards that our Club has operated under over the years.

Advisor, Connie Sorrell - She guides us with her invaluable amount of experience.

Awards Chairman, Nancy Lee - She has submitted numerous applications to the district and state expounding on all of our accomplishments. Because of her tenaciousness, we have received 10 blue ribbons from VFGC and 1 red and 11 blue ribbons from the Piedmont District of the VFGC.

Civic Beautification Chairman, Meg Winn - She has exceeded far beyond anyone's expectations. Under her leadership, her numerous committee Heads have undertaken the maintenance of the Anniversary Garden, Beth Snelling Garden at Midlothian Highschool, Reta Good Garden at the Lifelong Learning Institute, Manakin Episcopal Church Garden, Midlothian Fire Station, Midlothian Post Office, Redeemer Courtyard, Wishing Well Park, The Daffodil Project and Salisbury Christmas Decorating. Our talents do not limit us to Midlothian. We also participate in National Garden Week and Meals on Wheels. A big thank you to Meg and her committee members especially those that have volunteered to water all these gardens throughout the summer. **Community Outreach Chairmen, Camille Archie and Lorna Boucher** - They and their committee have taken their commitment to another level. Our members have shown patience and humor when making flower arrangements with rambunctious 5th graders or helped to provide relevant gardening activities to disadvantaged kids from ages 5 to 10 yrs old. It may also be providing a stimulating activity for a Vet who is suffering from PTSD, helping a senior at Bickford make a flower arrangement for her room, refurbishing the outside planters at the Spring Arbor Memory Care or making monthly flower arrangements for the patients' rooms and public areas at the Hospice House.

Exhibits Chairmen, Joanne Wallace and Fran Judd - A big thank you for helping us identify our horticultural, helping to fill out the cards correctly and making sure they are displayed properly in a clean glass container. In addition, she organizes the Gardeners' Exchange to help clean out our attics. Also, thanks to Fran Judd for finding judges to grade us on all our horticultural and flower arrangements. But most of all for allowing us to store all of the Club's supplies in her garage.

Flower Show, Kathy Ward - What can we say about our Salisbury Garden Club's Biennial Flower Show "Come Fly With Me". It was phenomenal. It was held on May 5th at the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer from 1:00-7:00. All of our Members participated in some sort capacity or another. The Judges could not stop expounding on the high level of creativity of the designs and the impressive horticultural.

Monthly Hospitality Chairman, Jean Hillsman - Each month she sets our dining area with a beautiful flower arrangement. Food is prepared by eight different hostesses for each monthly meeting. Coffee, tea and water are provided by the Club. The social time starts at 9:30 and ends at 10:00 just before the meeting commences. These hostesses arrive early to set-up and stay afterwards to help with the clean-up.

Newsletter Publisher, Linda Nau - She has compiled, organized and printed photos to produce an award-winning newsletter "Mums the Word". Committee Chairmen provide articles for this monthly newsletter. It also contains the Treasurer's report, what projects have taken place and what new projects will be happening in the coming months. Helpful gardening hints are displayed throughout the newsletter. Linda is also the editor of our yearbook, which has consistently won top awards. It is what you would call "Our Bible" when it comes to the Garden Club. She was also responsible for the enormous job of all of the signage at the Flower Show.

Parliamentarian, Cindy Nasser - She is our resource person to make sure that procedural rules are being followed so that meetings run properly and smoothly

Social Hospitality Chairmen, Martie Parch and Janice Beatty - They are in charge of the annual Christmas Party which was held at the Salisbury Country Club. Our final social event is the Awards and Installation Luncheon held in May at Sunday's Boathouse. This is when we recognize and present awards to Members for their outstanding participation throughout the year. This is also when the new Board is installed.
